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

26 PEBBLES



December 14, 2012. 26 innocent lives were taken at Sandy Hook Elementary. A reporter visits the town for a few days and then stays for 3 months. He asked five interview questions of each person: What things do you love about Newtown? Traditions? Locations? What was your day like on December 14? Take me from waking up in the morning to your head on the pillow at night.

Does this shooting shake your faith? Can (any form of) God exist when tragedies like this happen? What are your thoughts about Adam Lanza, the shooter? Do you blame him? What is the one word you'd want Newtown to be remembered for? In their own words, people spoke about the importance of community, healing, resilience, perseverance, hope and outpourings of love from around the world. Like pebbles thrown in a pond, these 26 deaths created ripples that still reverberate today.
