# From the **ARTISTIC DIRECTOR**

#### We have been through a lot together. Even when we were apart.

Nothing could have prepared me for the new reality of Covid. It was something I never imagined could happen to me, to us. When I first heard about the coronavirus, I, like many people, believed it was kinda

like the flu and thought "don't panic." But I remembered the day that I DID panic. When I learned what we were really in for, I felt a fear so deeply in my bones that it has never left me.
